

POLISH OPEN

15 - 17.10.2021, POLAND

National coach Raphael Veras has been at the Polish Open with Jenny Warling, Jordan Neves, Pola Giorgetti and Adil Khaidar (from left to right) to further optimize their form. The tournament was well represented with a total of 31 countries.

With a bronze medal for Pola Giorgetti, the team flew back to Luxembourg. Jenny Warling, on the other hand, had started well into the tournament, but then lost to the Diana Shostak. Although she got into the repechage, she decided not to continue fighting in order to spare herself. Jordan Neves won the first round convincingly, but then lost in the second round to the later winner, so that Jordan also came into the repechage. There he was leading, but unfortunately had to take a hit 3 seconds before the end, so that he was eliminated there as well. Adil Khaidar unfortunately lost his first round and didn't get a chance for repechage.

Du bronze pour Giorgetti

Je suis venu pour que mes athdailles.» Avant l'Open de Pologne de Bielsko-Biala, l'entraîneur national Raphaël Veras annonçait la couleur. Eh bien, le technicien britannico-brésilien doit être satisfait. En effet, une de ses combattants repart de Pologne avec une médaille. Et pour une fois, ce n'est pas Jenny Warling (-55 kg) qui s'est mise en évidence. La chef de file de l'art de la main vide au Grand-Duché, qui restait sur plusieurs très bonnes prestations, n'a, cette fois, pas connu la même réussite. Battue d'entrée par l'Ukrainienne Diana Shostak (1-3), qui la frappe à son genou blessé, elle préfère ne pas participer aux repèchages, face à l'Écossaise Amy Connell: «Dans les trente premières secondes, l'Ukrainienne m'a frappée dans le genou. Après, je n'osais plus m'approcher. J'ai attaqué de trop loin et elle m'a contrée. Heureusement, j'avais le genou "tapé"», confie l'ancienne championne d'Europe, qui se classe finalement 7e.

C'est sa copine Pola Giorgetti (+68 kg) qui s'est cette fois montrée à son avantage. En forme, après avoir remporté deux médailles aux championnats d'Europe des petites nations il y a quelques semaines, elle a d'abord pris le dessus sur la n° 1 polonaise Kinga Harast (1-0) avant de dominer sur le même score l'Allemande Amelie Lücke. Au troisième tour, elle cède (0-2) contre l'Écossaise, Niamh Junner. En repêchages, elle domine la Polonaise Patrycja Szelagiewicz (2-1) pour décrocher une magnifique médaille de bronze: «Je vois la progression de Pola. Faire des résultats demande du temps. Je suis content pour elle», se réjouit le technicien. «La médaille c'est toujours l'objectif, mais je ne me suis pas trop pris la tête. Je me suis simplement dit de bien combattre avec détermination. Je me sens plutôt bien en ce moment. Je profiterai des semaines à venir pour encore travail-ler sur quelques points», indique la combattante grand-ducale.

Deux autres Luxembourgeois étaient en Pologne. Chez les -75 kg, Jordan Neves se défend bien. Il remporte facilement son premier tour contre le régional de l'étape, Patryk Kobus (7-0), avant de plier face au Danois Mads Larsen Viberg (0-1). En repêchage, le combattant grand-ducal s'incline de justesse face au Slovaque Marek Simun (3-3) et prend la 9° place. Quant à Adil Khaidar (-84 kg), il perd au premier tour contre un autre Danois, Michel Corbalan (0-2). Pas de repêchages pour lui.

SPORTMELDUNGEN IM ÜBERBLICK -

Karate: Doppelgold für Marques, Bronze für Giorgetti

Mit 367 Athleten aus 62 Vereinen und 13 Ländern (504 Einschreibungen) war die "Coupe internationale de Kayl 2021 am Wochenende top besetzt. Luxemburg wurde durch sieben Vereine und eine Nationalauswahl vertreten, die insgesamt 155 Einsätze bestritten. Trotz starker ausländischer Konkurrenz schlugen sich die FLAM-Kämpfer in allen Altersklassen hervorragend und errangen an den beiden Wettkampftagen im Kata und im Kumite 52 Medaillen: 10 Gold-, 17 Silber- und 25 Bronzeplätze. Herausragend verlief der Auf-tritt von David Marques (FLAM) im Kayler Sportzentrum, der sowohl bei der Elite (+75 kg), als auch bei den U21 (Open) auf dem obersten Treppchen stand. Yanis Tamim (-75 kg, Differdingen) holte ebenfalls Gold bei den Senioren. U16-Gold gewannen Tomas Vicente (Strassen) und Jordan Sibille (Differdingen), bei den U12 siegte Zineb Belabass (Strassen), bei den U10 Lena El Meskiri (Niederanven) und Emil Mujanovic (Kayl), bei den U9 Jairo Mineiro (Walfer) und bei den Ü35 Tamara Schuh (Kayl, die beiden letzteren im Kata). Im Medaillenspiegel schloss Luxemburg hinter Belgien (28 Gold) auf Platz zwei ab. Beste Einzelplatzierungen gingen an die Nationalmannschaft (Platz 7) KC Differdingen (Platz 8), Chinto Kayl (Platz 10) und Strassen (Platz 13), mit je zweimal Gold. Alle Ergebnisse und Medaillen sind unter www.sportdata.org nachzulesen.

Bei den "Polish Open 2021" lief es nicht ganz wunschgemäß. Pech hatte vor allem Jenny Warling (-55 kg, 21 Teil-

nehmerinnen), die nach Freilos mit Diana Shostak ein Hammerlos erwischte. Die Ukrainerin gewann den Kampf mit 3:1 und holte später Gold. In der Trostrunde kam Warling nicht über ein 0:0 gegen Ami Connell hinaus, die Referees sahen die Schottin im Vorteil, die anschließend Bronze gewann. Deutlich besser lief es für Pola Giorgetti (+68 kg, 13 Teilnehmerinnen). Die Niederanvenerin konnte ihre ersten beiden Kämpfe gegen Kinga Harast (POL) und Amelie Lücke (D) mit 1:0 gewinnen, scheiterte aber im entscheidenden Fight an Niamh Junner (SCO). Den Kampf um Bronze konnte Giorgetti letzten Endes gegen Patrycja Sze-lagiewicz für sich entscheiden und holte damit die Kastanien für Luxemburg aus dem Feuer. Die beiden männlichen Vertreter

schafften keine Überraschung. Adil Khaidar (-84 kg, 28 Teilnehmer) schied bei seiner Premiere auf diesem Niveau in der
ersten Runde aus, Jordan Neves
(-75 kg, 28 Teilnehmer) landete mit einem Auftaktsieg, einem
klaren 7:0 gegen Patry Kobus
(POL), einen Achtungserfolg,
steckte aber in Runde zwei und
in der Trostrunde eine knappe
Niederlage ein.

PREVENTION OF VIOLENCE

No lack of civil courage

During a workout in the gym, the music is loud and encourages more performance. Suddenly, someone falls over and cries "Ouch". Why doesn't anyone go and help?

It's recess at school. 200 children are playing and romping through the schoolyard. A little girl is standing on a sidewalk in front of the school. Across from her is a grown man. The girl laughs at the man - who is the man? Who is going to go and help?

An elderly person is apparently being prevented from entering the lane by young people and is being attacked in the worst way. Why does no one go and help?

Five steps to help

Researchers describe a five-stage process that determines whether a bystander will help or not help in a situation where help would be objectively indicated. First, the researchers speak of the fundamentally latent diffusion of responsibility - a phenomenon that occurs more strongly the more bystanders there are. Behind this is the subjective thought of the individual that someone else will already help, which means that he himself no longer has to intervene. This phenomenon is at least reduced if

- the emergency situation is clearly recognizable
- the request for help is made
- the competence of other helpers is considered to be much lower, or
- the victim is a child under the age of nine.

In cases where massive acts of violence were threatened, the opposite effects were also observed. The more people were present, the more likely an intervention was - this is called the positive bystander effect.





Figure 1 - Five levels of assistance

The five stages form a model (Figure 1) that ultimately determines whether or not a potential helper will intervene on behalf of the victim. In addition, there are options in each stage to influence the helper's thought process - in favor of or against helping.

In the following issues, we will shed more light on this topic.

1.1 Perception

The event itself must first be perceived by the witnesses' senses. Thus, in the vast majority of situations, visual or auditory impressions are likely to be responsible for perception. If a crowd forms, shouts or screams are heard, or a threatening situation is clearly visible, people may become aware. The attention threshold can be lowered so much by hurrying past due to temporal urgency or by being absorbed in media such as newspapers or smartphones that the situation cannot be taken in on its own motivation. Furthermore, the sense of hearing in public spaces is increasingly impaired by worn headphones.

In the following issues, we will shed more light on the topic of "assistance".

IN THE SPOTLIGHT

KIMBERLY NELTING

NATIONAL SQUAD KUMITE SENIOR KC NIEDERANVEN / WORLD AND FUROPEAN CHAMPION

How old were you when you started karate and why?

When I was 6 years old, my father set me and my older brother Cassidy the task of earning a black belt in karate so that we could later defend ourselves.

How often do you train per week and where? I train a total of six times a week. Mondays at my club, Tuesdays at LIHPS (Luxembourg Institute for High Performance in Sports), Wednesdays, Thursdays & Fridays at the national squad and on weekends either at LIHPS or I fight at tournaments.

What was your first karate success?

My first victory at a tournament was the "Coupe FLAM" in Differdange. At that time I was mega proud about the mega big trophy

What was your biggest success so far and what is your next goal?

I think that was clearly my junior world title in 2017, closely followed by my just achieved U21 European title this year. I was especially proud to leave both my junior (-59kg) and U21 (-61kg) categories as the world number one in each to the next higher category. My next goal is to take care of my professional training. I took a gap year for the Olympic qualification and for the U21 European Championship to be able to concentrate on karate. For this reason, I am now taking a break from karate.



Who is your biggest role model?

Definitely my family. My parents: They are always there for me, whereby my father has been my "manager" throughout the years, whether it was just to bring me a forgotten Tshirt or to accompany me to almost all tournaments; my mother, on the other hand, always makes sure that I eat healthy and get enough sleep. My big sister: Because she is always there for me, especially when I am not doing so well. My brother, four years older than me, whom I could always look up to, after all he was already a black belt when I was only a blue belt, and "last but not least" my handicapped sister, who was able to take part in my world championship title at that time and to whom I therefore also dedicated the gold medal from Tenerife.

What was a significant or funny event in karate for you?

My 100th medal was exactly the gold medal at the 2017 World Championships in Tenerife.

EMMA THUY

NATIONAL SQUAD KATA KC WALFER / U12 STATE CHAMPION

How old were you when you started karate and why?

I started with karate when I was 10 years old. At that time I was already doing another sport and I wanted to start with a new, second sport. I chose karate because I had already tried and liked karate when I was 6 years old, but stopped after a month because of the unsuitable training times

How often do you train per week and where?


I train as follows: 2 times a week gymnastics at Le Réveil Bettembourg, about 2-4 times a week karate in the national squad and from time to time in the club.

What was your first karate success?

My first karate success was third place at the Coupe des Coupes competition in 2018 when I was 11 years old.

What was your biggest success so far and what is your next goal?

My biggest success was the national championships 2019, there I became national champion in the category U12. My next goal is to participate in international competitions and to be able to achieve a podium finish.



Who is your biggest role model?

My biggest role model is the Karate World Champion in the discipline Kata Team Jasmin Jüttner from Germany.

What was a significant or funny event in karate for you?

One of my most significant events in karate was finishing second at the Coupe des Coupes competition in 2019. At the time, I was an orange belt and competing against much better and older candidates. I did not expect second place after seeing my opponents. Nevertheless, I won against candidates with a much higher belt, such as blue and even once brown and got the second place.
